Porto Faculty of Law, Universidade Católica Portuguesa is organizing a Training Course for Judges on Competition Law to be held in April 2019. It is funded by the European Commission and supported by CEJ (Centre for Judicial Studies).

**Targeted Audience:** Portuguese, Spanish and Polish judges.

**Goals:**

This course aims to train national judges on recent case law of the Court of Justice on Articles 101 and 102 TFEU and to share information concerning the national developments under the Private Enforcement Directive (2014/104/UE), providing national judges with intensive and in-depth training on these issues through lectures, workshops and conferences.

**Languages:**

Plenary sessions and workshops to be lectured in Portuguese and English  
Final conference in English.

- **6<sup>th</sup> of March** - Notification of admission
- **15<sup>th</sup> of March** - Provision of the online campus access key
- **20<sup>th</sup> March** - Preparatory meeting through videoconference/audioconference

- **6<sup>th</sup> April, 2019** - International Conference (open session)

Participation is free, subject to mandatory registration and subsequent authorization (according to national rules).

Porto Faculty of Law, Universidade Católica Portuguesa, supported by the European Commission, will cover the following costs:
